The Strongway Manual Lever Hoist is a portable lifting device easily operated with a hand chain. It's suitable for use in garages, workshops, and warehouses for loading and unloading goods. It is advantageous for lifting work in open air grounds and places where a power supply is not available.

#### **HOIST USE AND CARE**

- Do not force the hoist. Products are safer and do a better job when used in the manner for which they are designed. Plan your work, and use the correct product for the job.
- Check for damaged parts before each use. Carefully check that the product will operate properly
  and perform its intended function. Replace damaged or worn parts immediately. Never operate the
  product with a damaged part.
- Do not use a product with a malfunctioning switch. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the power switch is dangerous and must be repaired by an authorized service representative

before using.

- Disconnect the power/air supply from the product and place the switch in the locked or off position before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing the tool. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the tool accidentally.
- Store the product when it is not in use. Store it in a dry, secure place out of the reach of children. Inspect the tool for good working condition prior to storage and before re-use.
- Use only accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer for use with your product.

## **Specific Operation Warnings**

#### **MARNING**

- Do not use hoist with extension on lever handle.
- Do not use in a way that causes either hook to be side loaded.
- · Do not use chain hoist as a sling.
- Do not support load on hook unless hook is designed for tip loading.
- Do not operate if restricted from forming a straight line from hook to hook in the direction of loading.
- Inspect for damaged parts before use. Do not use if damaged.
- Examine each chain link for damage or weak links before use. Do not operate a hoist with twisted, kinked or damaged chain.
- Do not lift people, animals, or loads above people.
- Do not pull chain at an angle.
  - Keep bystanders away while hoist is loaded.
- Not for use by or around children.

#### **Before Each Use**

#### **AWARNING**

- Before operating, make sure that the hoist is not in the free chain mode and always check that the selector is placed in the proper position.
- DO NOT touch or operate the hoist's free knob while a load is applied to the hoist.
- Inspect for damaged parts before use. Do not use if damaged.
- Examine each chain link for damage or weak links before use. Do not operate a hoist with twisted, kinked or damaged chain.

## **Operating Instructions**

#### **MARNING**

- To reduce the risk of injury, operate hoist using manual power only.
- Do not exceed the rated load capacity
- Do not use hoist with extension on lever handle.
- Do not use in a way that causes either hook to be side loaded.
- Do not use chain hoist as a sling.
- Do not support load on hook unless hook is designed for tip loading.
- Do not operate if restricted from forming a straight line from hook to hook in the direction of loading.
- Properly seat the suspension hook on the supporting structure at its intended load bearing point (Figure 1). Do not allow the hook hitch to support any part of the load. Do not apply the load to the point of the hook (Figure 1).



#### Correct and incorrect suspension hook attachment

- Properly seat the sling or other device in the base (bowl or saddle) of the hook (Figure 2). Do not allow the hook hitch to support any part of the load.
- Do not apply the load to the point of the hook (Figure 2).




The hoist may be used either in a vertical position as a hoist or in an angled or horizontal position as a puller. Below is the general procedure for operating the hoist:


- 1. Set the top hook securely.
- 2. Correctly center the load on the bottom hook. Incorrect loading is dangerous to the operator, the lever hoist, and the load.
- 3. Place the selector switch on the handle in the center neutral position. This will allow the freewheel mode. The chain will be in free-wheel mode when there is no load. Take up slack by pulling on the loose or free end or by turning the hand wheel.
- 4. Move the selector switch to the UP position. Ratchet the lever to raise or pull the load. Do not overload the lever hoist.
- 5. To release or lower the load, turn selector switch on the handle to the DOWN position and ratchet the handle.

## Maintenance

Maintain the product by adopting a program of conscientious repair and maintenance in accordance with the following recommended procedures. It is recommended that the general condition of any tool be examined before it is used. Keep your tool in good repair. Keep handles dry, clean, and free from oil and grease. The following chart is based on a normal operation schedule.

Maintenance Interval	Maintenance Point	
Daily before operating	Inspect the general condition of the hoist. Check for loose screws, misalignment or binding of moving parts, cracked or broken parts, and any other condition that may affect its safe operation. If abnormal noise occurs, have the problem corrected before further use. Do not use damaged equipment.	
Quarterly (3 months)	Keep all moving parts lubricated at all times. Use common gear oil. For best results, the load chain should be cleaned with an acid-free cleaning solution prior to lubrication.

The foregoing warranty is valid only if the installation and use of the product is strictly in accordance with product instructions. There are no other warranties, express or implied, including the warranty of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose. If the product does not comply with this limited warranty, Your sole and exclusive remedy is that We will, at our sole option and within a commercially reasonable time, either replace the product or product component without charge to You or refund the purchase price (less shipping). This limited warranty is not transferable.

#### **Limitations on the Warranty**
